JEWELLERY & HAIR/MAKE-UP

We are noticing more and more that children are coming to school with unacceptable jewellery, hair accessories and/or make-up e.g. nail varnish, lip gloss.

Please be reminded that jewellery is not part of the school uniform and should not be worn, unless it is:

- one small, plain gold or silver stud may be worn in each ear
- a plain, simple analogue watch (from Y3 upwards)
- a small item of religious significance which must be worn under clothing for health and safety reasons. These items should be removed for PE and the school WILL NOT take any responsibility for injury, damage or loss.

For health and safety reasons, all children with long hair (shoulderlength or more) must have this tied back. All accessories must be practical for school (e.g avoiding large bows or tassels) and should be yellow, white or black only. Extreme fashion styles and artificial colourings are not permitted.

TIMINGS OF THE SCHOOL DAY:

The school gate **opens at 08.40am** And closes just before 08.55am

All children should be **in class by 08.55am** Registration starts at 08.50am – 08.55am

Children who arrive after 08.55am will need to go via the office to ensure they are correctly registered. Parents/Carers of children (YR to Y4) must accompany their child(ren) into school.

Please note: From September 2023, parents/carers of children who arrive after 08.55am will need to sign their child in electronically at the office, to ensure they are marked as present*

The school day ends at **3.15pm** The school gate will open from 3.15pm - 3.25pm Parents/carers who arrive after this time will need to collect their child from the after school club.

SCHOOL UNIFORM:

Children must wear:

GREY Trousers/Skirts/Shorts BLACK School Shoes GREY Sweatshirt/Cardigan (with logo) GOLD Polo Shirts (with logo) Reception – Y4 WHITE Shirt & GOLD Tie (Year 5 & Year 6)

Summer uniform can also be worn up to October Half Term

PE KIT must be:

WHITE T-Shirt (with logo)* BLACK Shorts BLACK Tracksuit Bottoms Plain BLACK zipped-sweatshirt (preferably with logo) Plain BLACK Trainers Outdoor Waterproof Jacket with logo (optional)

Parents/carers are asked to remove children's earrings on P.E. days. Staff are NOT responsible for the removal or covering of earrings and the school WILL NOT take responsibility for any injury, damage or loss.
