### Message from the Head Teacher

Welcome back, after what I hope was an enjoyable half term break.

We began this month with the feast of All Saints. This feast day follows the previous Sunday's gospel reading from Matthew where the Pharisees test Jesus out by asking which are the most important commandments. Jesus' reply is quite direct:

You must love the Lord your God with all your soul, your heart and with all your mind. You must love your neighbour as yourself.

Jesus is quite detailed about how we must love. With the soul, heart and mind. We discussed in assemblies and liturgies how we use the word "love". We can say that "I love ice cream" or "I love playing FIFA". The children said that this brings on good feelings of "happiness" and "warmth" (although perhaps not with ice cream specifically!) and that the prospect of these things gives them a sense of excitement. With the concept of "falling in love", the children also said that this could bring a sense of excitement every time they see that person, that they miss them when they are not around because they feel incomplete, and their connection with that person is very deep. We clearly have a richness of potential philosophers and relationship counsellors in our ranks!

In this gospel, Jesus also tells us about our priorities for love in rank order. Love God, love each other and then love yourself. This, together with the Beatitudes, provides the guidance that we need to strive for sainthood. All of our schools want the best for their children, of course. They want to ensure that children achieve excellence, and that they are nurtured so that they can become well-rounded adults and responsible citizens. But we can go a stage further, we can **aspire to sainthood**. As Pope Benedict reminded us when he spoke to schoolchildren from across the country back in 2010 by striving for sainthood, the love we show for God will be a deep spiritual love that we crave throughout our lives:

When I invite you to become saints, I am asking you not to be content with second best. I am asking you not to pursue one limited goal and ignore all the others.

We need to have the courage to place our deepest hopes in God alone, not in money, in a career, in worldly success, or in our relationships with others, but in God. Only he can satisfy the deepest needs of our hearts.

We see children aspiring for sainthood every day. As you will see from the charity work, the open evening and just the way children look out for each other in school, that depth of love for God and each other thrives here in school.

We may be tempted to say, "He/She is no saint" when our children are testing us out, but looking at many of the saints, their track record in the early part of their lives was far from perfect. Start with St. Peter and keep going! What is true, however, is that when difficult choices need to be made and values are tested, our children instinctively think about what Jesus would do.
