







<p><b>RELIGIOUS EDUCATION</b></p> <p>In R.E., children will show knowledge and understanding of scripture passages related to:</p> <p><b>Local Church;</b></p> <p><b>Community - Mission</b></p> <p>Continuing Jesus' mission in diocese [ecumenism];</p> <p><b>Eucharist Relating - Memorial Sacrifice</b></p> <p>The Eucharist, the living memorial of Jesus' sacrifice;</p> <p><b>Lent/Easter Giving - Sacrifice</b></p> <p>Lent, a time of aligning with the sacrifice already made by Jesus.</p> <p><b>Parent Top Tip:</b> Attend Sunday Mass (or your preferred place of worship) as a family for an experience of a faith community. Encourage your child to do something extra, or give something up, during Lent.</p>	<p><b>ICT</b></p> <p><b>Programming - Sonic Pi</b></p> <p>In this unit, children will create a program that plays themed music. They will learn how to plan a soundtrack, to program a soundtrack and to program music for a specific purpose.</p> 	<p><b>LITERACY</b></p> <p><b>Reading</b></p> <p>Holes, Suffragette: The Battle for Equality, The Highwayman Tower, Tales From The Caribbean and Dark Sky, Journey to Joburg.</p> <p><b>Writing</b></p> <p><b>How to be a World Explorer</b> - to engage the reader using hooks; to vary sentence length by focusing on the detail required.</p> <p><b>Tales of Outer Suburbia</b> - to understand that imagery and dialogue can create a sense of place.</p> <p><b>Boy in the tower</b> - explore how to create suspense; to create tension through plotting and word choices.</p> <p>Grammar is taught within our writing lessons, Spellings patterns are taught weekly.</p> <p><b>Parent Top Tip:</b> Continue to encourage your child to complete their Accelerated Reader quizzes.</p> <div data-bbox="705 750 1276 842"> <p><b>YEAR 5 – Spring 2024</b> Miss Ward &amp; Miss Delpratt</p> </div>	<p><b>MUSIC</b></p> <p>Telling stories with music: composing contrasting musical motifs to describe different characters (Binary Form); creating music to accompany a poem or picture.</p> <p><b>Parent Top Tip:</b> Invite your child to compose a song using their voice, or an instrument that you have at home.</p> <p><b>FRENCH</b></p> <p>This term will focus on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Shopping in France</li> <li>• French-speaking world</li> </ul>  <p><b>Parent Top Tip:</b> Invite your child to share the French words for food items. Ask them to put them into sentences.</p>	<p><b>ART</b></p> <p>This term will focus on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Inuit Art</li> </ul> <p><b>Parent Top Tip:</b> Encourage your child to use the sketching and shading techniques taught in school.</p>  <p><b>PSHE</b></p> <p>The children will explore body image, feelings, menstruation, hope beyond death, coping with changed and being called by God.</p> <p><b>Parent Top Tip:</b> Talk to your child about body image and coping with changes.</p> 
	<p><b>PE</b></p> <p>This term in PE will be focussing on: Dance, Netball, Gymnastics and Tennis.</p> <p><b>Parent Top Tip:</b> Invite your child to practice their throwing and catching skills. If you have a hoop, invite them to practice shooting. Encourage your child to enjoy creating a dance.</p>	<p><b>NUMERACY</b></p> <p><b>This term in numeracy:</b></p> <p><b>Continue with Fractions A:</b> Add and subtract fractions including mixed numbers;</p> <p><b>Multiplication and Division B:</b> Multiplication using the formal column method; Division using the formal column method; Solving problems using multiplication and division.</p> <p><b>Fractions B:</b> Multiply fractions and mixed numbers .</p> <p><b>Also: Decimals and percentages, Perimeter and Area and Statistics.</b></p> <p><b>Parent Top Tip:</b> Encourage your child to talk about their learning in Maths and teach you how to use the methods that they have been learning.</p> 	<p><b>GEOGRAPHY/HISTORY</b></p> <p><b>Geography:</b></p> <p><b>The Americas</b> In this unit, the children travel to the North and South America.</p> <p><b>History:</b> Crime and punishment In this unit, the children will explore how and why Crime and Punishment has changed over time.</p> <p><b>Parent Top Tip:</b> Encourage your child to share their understanding of the terms 'continent', 'region', 'country', 'state' and 'city'.</p> 	<p><b>SCIENCE</b></p> <p><b>Circulatory System:</b></p> <p>Children will understand the parts involved in the circulatory system and their functions, the positive effects of exercise and the negative effects of drugs and alcohol.</p> <p><b>Living things and their habitats:</b></p> <p>Group living things in different ways, explore life cycles, describe and compare different reproductive processes in some animals and plants.</p>
