SCIENCE



In Science, we will be learning about light and animals: circulation and health.

We will be looking at how light travels through reflection, refraction etc.

In our second topic: We will be looking at Circulation and health.

GEOGRAPHY/HISTORY

History

The Sikh Empire – exploring how the Sikh Empire was founded and its legacy. This unit allows children the opportunity to explore sources and deepen their understanding. It allows children to identify skills and behaviours of leaders, describe and assess the impacts of beliefs and apply criteria to make historical significance.



Geography

Children will investigate and carry out an independent fieldwork study. They will learn about issues in the local area, identify questions and relevant data and design accurate data collection samples. They will manage the risks of a fieldwork trip and map data digitally, enabling them to describe the enquiry process.



Planning a French holiday.

The children learn to use a combination of present and near-future tenses, and become familiar with holiday-related vocabulary around packing a suitcase and planning a journey. They explore which countries they might visit and why and ultimately research and plan a holiday to France.
