- ❖ To improve the attendance of PP pupils
- ❖ To ensure all staff including LSAs are fully aware of the needs of PP pupils
- ❖ To achieve clarity around the precise needs of under-performing PP children and to ensure that these needs are being met.
- ❖ To embed Quality First teaching across all year groups
- ❖ To implement more rigorous tracking of PP pupil progress
- ❖ To deliver training to all staff including LSAs on pupil data and analysis
- ❖ Increase the number of PP pupils attending extra-curricular clubs
- ❖ Support parents in helping their children achieve

### Outcomes to date:

Ensuring staff have a much better awareness of the needs of Pupil Premium children and how to use data to inform practice and appropriate interventions has had a very positive impact on outcomes across all year groups.

As seen from the data above the KS2 SATs results show a positive narrowing of the gap between PP pupils and non- PP pupils.

Analysis of outcomes for the other year groups shows that most PP pupils achieved their expected target or above. The area for development is Writing and this is a key focus across the school for all pupils this academic year.
